Are your car's Reflexes better than yours?

Brakes - Steering - Suspension

No matter how cat-like your reflexes are, if your vehicle's brakes aren't working properly, you're in trouble. We check your brakes, steering, front end & suspension to make sure your vehicle's reflexes are as good as yours.

Statistics, COI, and Expense

Estimate of repair time: 1 hour

While there are many components to your braking system, friction material (on your brake pads or brake shoes) is designed to wear for smooth operation, yet provide the braking force needed to operate properly.

Regenerative brake adjustments.

Adjust and clean brakes every 30,000 miles **\$150.**

\$1,000+ for new calipers brake pads.

Full Brake job on standard 4 door sedan due to neglect **\$1000+**

How to check your brake pads

First, check for wear by looking at your brake pads through the spaces between the wheel's spokes. The outside pad will be pressed against a metal rotor. Generally, there should be at least 1/4 inch of pad. If you see less than 1/4 inch of pad, you may want to have your brake pads inspected or replaced.
